## Speaking to the teacher

We operate an open door policy where we encourage you to tell us anything that will help us teach your child with maximum impact every day.

It is also important to note that during the hours of school time, the teachers **MUST** be teaching and supervising your children. This means that they will need to go in with their children after the class line up. This is to ensure that all children are safe and we maximise the learning time.

There are support staff to pass on a message or you can leave a message at the office.

## Independence

We know how hard it may be for some parents to send their children to Nursery. They seem so little! Please rest assured that the teachers and staff in school have done this hundreds of times and know the curriculum inside out. They will be asking for your help! **Dummies, bottles and nappies** are not to be used in school. ## Educational Visits

Our school intent is 'MORE'. Staff ensure that all children have memorable experiences, oracy skills, read more and have lots of experiences to consolidate their learning. School subsidise these activities and pay using different funds.. In order to immerse children in their learning, staff research any activities that will help children with their learning. All parents are asked to contribute to your child's learning.

We ask for £8.50 per term. This needs to be paid through Parent Pay.

Therefore £8.50 needs to be paid before the half term holidays.

## Parent Pay



We are a cashless school. School visits, dinner money and snack money need to be paid using this.

You will receive a code and instructions of how to set up your account ASAP. If you haven't got this already please speak to staff in the school office.

Remember, you can pay for more than one week if this is easier and more convenient for you.

Breakfast club needs to be paid in cash on the day.

## Snack money



We provide your child with a daily snack this includes; toast, biscuits, cereal, fruit and milk.

Please remember to pay £1.00 every Sunday to ensure that your child can have their snack.



## Topics

Your child will be learning about **Nursery Rhymes** and traditional tales within the first full term at Nursery. Please help them by sharing these stories with them, and asking questions about characters of the stories so that they can begin to remember some.

## Talking

**Talking** is vital especially at the start of the children's journey through school.

Encourage your child to talk about what they have been doing at school, what they are having for tea and what they are looking forward to the next day.

**Reading a bedtime story is a wonderful opportunity to share talk.**

## Reading books

Your child will come home with a book to share. Please share a book every day - it can be the same book or different ones. When a child shares a story, they can learn to answer and ask questions, and understand the story.

Discuss the characters, events and setting of the stories. It is so important for children to learn language and story language.

Your child will change their book once a week in Nursery, but they can read comics, newspapers, logos and more.

Be creative!

**Your child must bring their book bag every Monday, they will be returned on Tuesday.**

## Things to Remember

- ❖ Your child should come to school every day. We know children get ill sometimes but on average anything over 5 days a year is deemed excessive and will trigger EWO involvement.
- ❖ Every child should be wearing the correct school uniform as well as sensible shoes. **All uniform needs to be clearly labelled**, especially jumpers! Nursery children need to wear trousers that they can get up and down easily for toileting, in order to help prevent accidents
- ❖ Your child **must not** bring toys, dummies, blankets etc in to school. Bikes or scooters must not be ridden on the premises.
- ❖ **Jewellery** - It is school policy that the children are allowed a watch (not smart!) in school. No other jewellery (including studs) are permitted.
- ❖ You must ensure your child has a **coat** coming into school as they will undertake outdoor learning everyday! Dress appropriately for the weather each day with sun hat/sun cream if we are lucky enough to have some sun!
- ❖ You must not be late collecting your child. If this happens repeatedly you will be charged for childcare.
- ❖ The **office** will be open from **8.00am - 3.30pm**. You will need to leave a message on the answering machine out of these hours
- ❖ Please work with school to get the best for your child - we are here to help!
